When Something Ordinary Becomes a Revelation

My friend Pastor Kurt Jacobson has lung cancer. Kurt is in his late fifties. He never smoked. Until his diagnosis in March, he was active, vibrant, and healthy. He served Trinity Lutheran, Eau Claire, his whole ministry, over 28 years if I recall correctly. Kurt decided to step down last June to offer his gifts to the larger Church as a consultant with congregations who are working through transitions. My last congregation, Hope, Eau Claire, contracted with Kurt to plan for my "retirement" and transition to my successor. Now Kurt is in the most significant transition of his life—learning to live fully and joyfully as he prepares to die.

I follow Kurt's postings on the website "CaringBridge." They bring such joy to me, even in the midst of my grief for him. This week his post was "When Something Ordinary Became a Revelation." He describes the moments he regained his singing voice during the hymn:

For the first time in six months I could add my voice to those around me as the good people of Bethany offered praises to God, I could once again sing with them:

Now the feast and celebration, all of creation sings for joy.

After a painfully long winter, I was once again part of the creation singing for joy. Thanks to an amazingly fast acting effective "targeted treatment"... I am no longer coughing. Gone are the catches down deep in my right lung. Gone is the pain stopping me from trying to sing. This morning there was no more lip syncing and passively watching the words on the screen, feeling like a spectator versus a participant. Today my body had the ability and strength to get caught up in singing as I've done for years with resultant joy.

In the "Communion of Saints" at Bethany Lutheran, Rice Lake WI (my former congregation), Kurt experienced a joy that often only is fully realized after a loss regained. He could sing again! This is resurrection this side of the grave. This is what we all can experience each and every day if we see life as a gift that has an end, and a promise from Jesus that has no end.

I am reminded of a powerful song from one of my favorite folk singers, the late Tom Dundee, from his signature song A Delicate Balance:

Deep within there is a vision
That time is nothing but space,
And between every minute and mile that is in it
Somehow there is a beautiful face.

And it's all such a delicate balance
That the sport of infinity gives,
Expectations we have can lead down the path
Where that devil discouragement lives.

And it's all such a delicate balance
As it turns through the circles of air,
To worry does nothing but steals from the loving
And robs from the pleasure that's there.

Befriender Up-Date

It has been a while since we have up-dated our congregation on the many wonderful ways the Befrienders have blessed us at First. At a recent meeting we were able to reconnect and find out what we have been doing and what we still need to do.

Those who are involved with the program have gone through a year or more of training to learn how to be an extension of our out-reach ministry at First. There are those members of our congregation who can no longer participate in our busy activities and worship at church because of advanced age or health concerns. Those members can feel left out and lonely. As members of the church we want them to know we still care and haven't forgotten about them. This is where the Befriender team comes in. Our Befrienders go to various homes or institutions approximately once a month to visit the shut-ins and provide them with communion and any church information the person may need to know. Our prayer shawl ministry makes shawls and these are taken to the shut-ins as a special reminder that God has wrapped them in His love.

Our parish nurse, Bob Gionet, works with the Befrienders. If a Befriender notices some changes in the receiver that may warrant a nursing visit, Bob will come with the Befriender to evaluate the situation. He may contact an individual or make recommendations as to what steps should be taken.

We have members who may need a Befriender or would like to know more about the program. There are times when we don't know about a need and feel bad because we were not aware. Please let us know if this happens. All members are protected by the HIPPA law and any information we receive is confidential. I have learned a lot already! My favorite part is being able to connect with you and I am looking forward to connect with you more as I become more situated in my role here at First. I really enjoy listening and talking to you all! I have not been able to reach out to the elementary or high school youth like I have wanted, but all in good time. I know the end of the school year is a busy time for many. I encourage you all to participate in Youth & Family events as I will do my best to provide a variety of opportunities to fit different interests.

One of the first things that I would like to focus on, besides events, is healthy communication. While I was on Captive Free, we had training in the importance of communication. When you're traveling with 4 other people - initially strangers - in a van and are around each other 24/7, you have to talk through everything. I will be sharing what I know about how to create a compassionate atmosphere of positive communication. I am by no means an expert, but I believe being able to have healthy conversations is an important skill to have. Ultimately, I'm here as an advocate for ALL members at First and want to make sure I hear from anyone who would like their voice heard.

Even though I might not be as far into the pool as I would like, I'm still swimming and heading in the right direction. Thank you to all who have checked in with me just to see how I'm doing! Your kindness has made me feel welcome and even more excited to be your advocate as Youth & Family Leader.

From the Parish Nurse....

Happy Mother's Day! A few people have talked with me lately about checking their blood pressure at home. I'm happy to see them becoming active in their personal health. No, I'm not worried about losing my job.

If you are thinking about purchasing a BP monitor for yourself I recommend you talk with the pharmacist where ever you decide to buy a BP cuff/monitor. The pharmacist is most knowledgeable in what is on the shelf at their store. You can expect to pay about \$60 for a good blood pressure monitor. All the monitors come with instructions on how to properly apply the cuff. Also, you must make sure you have the correct size cuff for your arm. Again, the pharmacist will help you with this.

The American Heart Association has information on how to properly check your blood pressure at home. Go to: www.heart.org, then search "check blood pressure at home". I have printed their suggestion sheet and put some on the bulletin board outside my office in Friendship Hall. Please help yourself to one.

I can help you make sure you are putting the cuff on correctly if you're having trouble. I'm at church most Mondays from 9 am to noon (you may want to call the church office to verify I am in) and on the second Sunday of each month from 9 am to 10:30 am. You can always contact me through the church office, 920-885-4497, leave a message with your name, number, and when is a good time for me to return your call.
