Dear Friends of First,

As we move into the summer months and daylight is lengthened, many of us will want to experience times when the pace of our lives gives way to new patterns. In the gospels, we learn how Jesus took time away-sometimes, going to a high mountain, sometimes to the wilderness, sometimes to the Sea of Galilee, where we learn that he slept even in the midst of a storm. Most often these were also times of prayer. Times of rest provided renewal from the times of labor and stress.

In the summer months, God does some new things and provides opportunity for us to adapt to some new patterns. God makes the daylight longer. Why? Some of it has to do with crops, birds, and photosynthesis. But it also has to do with hanging out in the evening where you might be able to connect with people who in the winter are hidden in their homes.

God makes the temperature warmer. Why? Well, this too has to do with flowers and trees and crops, because God loves us. But there are other reasons. God does it so that we will spend time outside and meet people in the neighborhood and at the park, that we would not normally meet during the winter months. God also warms up our night sky so that we will go outside after dark and look up at God's glory on display.

God has ordained that children have the summers off. Why? One reason is to reduce stress and improve mental health. Another reason is to provide an extra set of hands on the family farm, working the land and tending to the animals. Summer also opens opportunities to spend quality time with family, friends, and possibly travel to see God's handiwork in another place. Mountains, lakes, rivers, and even cities can reveal the works of God. Another reason is to open ministry opportunities up for children and families. Summer Bible Camps, Youth Gatherings, and Mission Trips. God can create and provide amazing opportunities and set new patterns during the summer months if we are open to letting God show us God's view of things.

So, as we move into the summer months and sense God is passing through the land with special blessings and renewal, the time seems right to seek God's fullness and power in some extraordinary ways. May God bless you and lead you into holy rest, renewal, and new patterns of life.

Finances at First

March ended with a net operating gain of \$31,56.94. YTD net operating sits at a loss of \$11,261.89. We continue to outpace last year's same month for in-person attendance, which leads to increased contributions. I would encourage people to get set up with automatic contributions through Simply Giving and the Vanco Mobile App.

The external audit for FY 2023 being performed by Wegner CPAs has started. We are awaiting the results and recommendations. As a reminder, the audit will cover Church Council compliance with bylaws, annual budget process, financial controls, offering/contribution reconciliation, cash account reconciliation, liabilities, income and expenses, credit cards, payroll, internal controls, related party transactions, contracts, and unrelated business income.

First Lutheran would like to highlight a valued staff member, John Huebner. Over the years, John has been a dedicated member of our custodial staff and has shared his time and talents with First Lutheran. Many congratulations and kudos are in order as he has decided to retire at the end of this year. The Personnel Committee will be looking to fill his position and find someone prior to his retirement so they can be properly trained.

If you or anyone you know is interested in a part time custodial position, contact the church office. More information to come on an official job posting as it gets closer to his retirement date.

Council Highlights

Greetings to the congregation of First Lutheran!

The April council meeting was held on April 21st. For the devotion, Leanne Gensch shared a personal story based on the Serenity Prayer. Sam Herringa will give the devotion in May. The council approved the agenda and amended meeting minutes from last month.

We invited Bryce Muenchow and Mary Irwin to the meeting to answer questions and share ideas to help Council decide if we should only have one Sunday service in the summer. After discussion about ways we could blend traditional and contemporary worship styles, a motion was made and passed to have one Sunday service, at 9am, from Sunday, May 26th to Sunday, September 1st. This will give people an opportunity to get to know other members who normally worship at a different time, fostering energy at a time of year when attendance is usually lower due to summer activities.

As we have done in the past, we will also cut back on office hours during the summer. The Thursday traditional service will continue at 1pm during the summer months. We will return to having two Sunday services after Labor Day.

Pastor Jim shared that he has had several funerals and is working with youth preparing for Confirmation. In addition, there is much to do to get ready for the upcoming Youth Gathering; 5 college students, 10 youth, and 4 adults will be going to New Orleans. Motion was made and passed to pay \$11,000 to cover registrations, hotel rooms, and expenses related to the youth gathering. The rummage sale team previously voted to cover their van rental.

Jim Feil reported that the month ended with a gain. Motion was made and passed to adopt the updated "Use of Facility Policy" for building rentals. We also

discussed Heidi Muenchow's concerns over postage increasing in July. An effort will be made to determine if people who currently receive printed copies of the Focus would prefer to receive church information by email or by picking up their copies at church.

Stacy Drews reported that Personnel Committee is featuring John Huebner in the May Focus. Stacy and Heidi continue to look at options to fill the Youth Director position.

Phyllis Marthaler shared that the rummage sale, bake sale, and food stand did well. A follow-up meeting will be on May 2nd to talk about what will be done with the proceeds and look ahead to future sales.

Evangelism plans to meet to teach people how to fit helmets. These helmets will then be given out the Summer Kickoff at Swam Park.

We were happy to hear Social Concerns sent 25 care packages to college students, a number much higher than recent years.

Council members felt the brunch with Marie Leafblad went well. Marie will be emailing the results from the activity so we can move forward with reviewing our Mission and Vision statements. This is our final step in the strategic planning done with Dan Feaster.

The next Church Council meeting will be Sunday, May 19th at 11:15am. Members are always welcome to attend!

Synod News

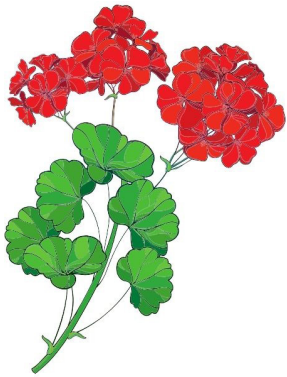
The 2024 South-Central Synod of Wisconsin's Synod Assembly will be held on Saturday, May 18th at First Lutheran Church in Janesville.
